

The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Kaskar): A script is under consideration. Terms and conditions for the production of the film are being finalised.

Export of Oils and Oilcakes

*365. Shri Hem Barua: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there has been a steady fall in the export of oils and oilcakes resulting in loss of traditional overseas markets; and

(b) if so, what steps have so far been taken to improve the position?

The Deputy Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Satish Chandra): (a) There has been a decline in the exports of vegetable oils, but exports of oilcakes have lately improved.

(b) Exports of oils have declined on account of our prices being high as compared to international prices. If the efforts to increase production of oil seeds succeed, it should be possible to make larger supplies available for export at competitive prices. A statement showing the steps taken to step up exports of oils and oilcakes is laid on the Table of the Lok Sabha. [See Appendix II, annexure No. 56.]

Change in the Course of River Ravi

*366. Sardar Iqbal Singh: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

(a) the acreage of land gone to Pakistan side due to the change in the course of Sutlej and Ravi Rivers during the year 1958; and

(b) the details and amount of help or assistance given by the Government of India and the Government of Punjab to the affected persons?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): (a) and (b). Information is being collected and will be placed on the Table of the House.

Sericulture Schemes in Manipur

*367. Shri Achaw Singh: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether any production target has been fixed for the approved sericulture schemes in Manipur; and

(b) if so, what is the annual return of production from the schemes already implemented in the Manipur Territory?

The Minister of Industry (Shri Manubhai Shah): (a) Yes, Sir. The Central Silk Board has fixed a production target of 3,500 pounds of raw silk per annum by the end of the Second Five-Year period.

बैदेशिक-कार्य उपमंत्री (श्रीमती लक्ष्मी मेनन) चीन सरकार ने हाल ही में जो जवाब पीकिंग स्थित हमारे राजदूतावास को दिया है, उस में उन्होंने लिखा है कि चीन में जो नक्सों हाल में छपे थे, उन में चीन और भारत समेत उस के पड़ोसी देशों के बीच सीमा की रेखा उन नक्सों के आधार पर खींची गई है जो स्वतन्त्रता के पूर्व चीन में छपे थे और चीन सरकार अभी तक चीन की सीमाओं का सर्वेक्षण नहीं किया, न उन्होंने संबंधित देशों के साथ सलाह-मन्त्रिणा किया और

वह कि चीन की सरकार अपनी मर्जी से सीमा में कोई परिवर्तन नहीं करेगी। जबकि मैं यह और लिखा है कि समय गुजर जाने, विभिन्न पड़ोसी देशों के साथ सलाह-मसिबरा करने और सीमांत क्षेत्रों का सर्वेक्षण करने के बाद, चीन सरकार का इरादा है कि वह अपने सर्वेक्षण के परिणामों और पड़ोसी सरकारों की सलाह के प्रनूकूल चीन की समा का रेखांकन फिर से करेगी।

(d) whether the police gave any cause for carrying out that search; and

(e) what action do Government propose to take in the matter?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shrimati Lakshmi Menon):
(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) For nearly two hours.

(d) When asked, they stated that there were maps in the I.A.C.'s office

which showed Kashmir as part of India and which were, therefore, objectionable under an order promulgated by the Chief Commissioner, Karachi.

(e) A strong protest has already been lodged with the Government of Pakistan.

(a) the further efforts made by the Government in collaboration with other countries in the U.N. Assembly for bringing about suspension of nuclear and thermo-nuclear test explosions;

(b) the names of countries which associated themselves with India for this purpose; and

(c) the results thereof?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): (a) The Indian delegation made all possible efforts to obtain general agreement on this important question. However, in the background of cold-war atmosphere, they did not succeed.

(b) India moved a resolution on 4th November in co-operation with 13 other countries. They were:
