(b) Government have taken some measures to curb undesirable activities. Any further steps to this end would depend on the development of a situation which is considered dangerous from the point of view of national security. Under our Constitution a great deal of freedom of activity and expression is permitted to individuals and political parties. Government are anxious to preserve this freedom in so far as it is possible.

Tea for Typhoon Victims in Japan

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri J. N. Hazarika): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir. The Government of India donated 3,000 lbs. of tea for the typhoon victims in Japan. This was, however, done through the Central Tea Board and not through the State Trading Corporation.
