Education of Tibetan Refugees

(a) whether the Union Government have decided to make certain arrangements for the education of Tibetan refugees; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of External Affairs (Shri Sadath Ali Khan): (a) and (b). There are three schools for Tibetan refugees children at Gangtok, Mussoorie and Kalimpong. The school at Mussoorie may shift to Dharamsala. A review has been undertaken to assess the educational needs of the entire Tibetan refugee population with a view to expanding the existing facilities. Hindi is now taught to adult refugees at the various Camps—Missamari, Dalhousie and Buxa.

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shrimati Lakshmi Menon): (a) to (c). The Government are aware that some Pakistanis in the United Kingdom have organised a Kashmir Plebiscite Front. They held a meeting in Birmingham on February 21, 1960. The Government are also aware that this group of Pakistanis have brought out a pamphlet about the defence of Sheikh Abdullah. Copies of this pamphlet are reported to have been received by some news papers in Delhi and perhaps in other parts of India. It is a propagandist pamphlet, and as such, bears little relation to facts.
