OBITUARY REFERENCE

MR. SPEAKER: Honourable Members, with a sense of great sorrow, I have to inform the House of the sad demise of one of our colleagues Shri Muhammed Khuda Bukhsh, who passed away early this morning at New Delhi at the age of 62. I am told that during the early hours this morning he complained of chest pain. The doctor attending on him advised that he be removed to the hospital. On reaching the hospital he was declared dead.

Shri Khuda Bukhsh was a sitting Member of this House representing Murshidabad constituency of West Bengal. He was a Member of the First and Second Lok Sabha during the years 1952-62. He had been a Member of the West Bengal Legislative Assembly during 1970-71. He was also

a Member of the Committee on Estimates. A sober man with dignified manners, Shri Khuda Bukhsh was a man of amiable disposition. A forceful speaker, he displayed discipline expected of a sound parliamentarian and he attended the sittings of the House regularly. He was with us here till yesterday and no one could imagine that destiny would take him away from us so soon.

We deeply mourn the loss of this friend and I am sure the House will join me in conveying our condolences to the bereaved family.

The House may stand in silence for a short while to express its sorrow.
