(c) what efforts are being made by the Central Government to make available medical assistance to rural poor where still no hospital or first aid centre exists?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA) : (a) No, Sir.

(b) Question does not arise.

(c) The Primary Health Care-facilities are being provided to the rural poor through the following programmes by :

- (i) providing one Health Guide for every 1000 population/every village and at least one trained Dai in every village.
- (ii) Providing a sub-centre with one male and one female Multipurpose Health Worker for every 5000 rural population in general and for every 3000 population in tribal and hilly areas.
- (iii) Upgrading existing rural dispensaries into subsidiary health centres and opening of new primary health centres so as to have ultimately one Primary Health Centre/Subsidiary Health Centre for every 30,000 rural population in general and for every 20,000 population in tribal and hilly areas.
- (iv) Providing facilities for treatment in basic specialities at upgraded Primary Health Centre/Community Health Centres, to be established in a phased manner, so that ultimately there is one upgraded PHC/CHC for every one lakh rural population.

Appointment of teachers by Jawaharlal  
Nehru University

4575. SHRI VIRDHI CHANDER

JAIN : Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that Jawaharlal Nehru University has failed to induct teachers from all over India in different faculties in terms of section 4 of the Jawaharlal Nehru University Act 1966 ;

(b) if so, what steps are intended to be taken by the Minister to deal with the situation ;

(c) whether it is also a fact that in matters of selection to various teaching positions, almost all candidates from the faculty members of the university are selected while ignoring far more promising and competent candidates from outside ; and

(d) if so, figures regarding teachers selected from within the university and outside between 1982-1985 ?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI K. C. PANT) : (a) No, Sir. The members of the faculty of the Jawaharlal Nehru University are drawn from 17 States and Union Territories.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) and (d). No, Sir. During the period from 1st January, 1982 to 31st July, 1985, the University selected 7 Professors, 11 Associate Professors and 23 Assistant Professors from outside against 10 Professors, 19 Associate Professors and 11 Assistant Professors from within the University.

(a) the present strength of staff, category-wise, in Jamalpur workshop (Bihar) ; and

**Surprise inspection of Etawah Railway Station by State Railway Minister**

4577. SHRI BALRAM SINGH YADAVA : Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state :

(a) whether a surprise inspection of the Etawah Railway Station (Northern Railway) was made by State Railway Minister, on 23 June, 1985 ; and

(b) if so, the deficiencies and irregularities found there ?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI BANSI LAL) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) A statement is given below.

**Statement**

The deficiencies and irregularities noticed during the inspection and action taken thereon are given below :

(i) The entrance of Etawah Railway Station was found to be dirty.

The Railway has since cleaned the place.

(ii) There was need to provide a small wall opposite the urinals on the platforms so that the users of the urinals may have privacy.

This has since been done.

(iii) Water taps in the bath rooms near the kitchen were disconnected some time back and there was need to restore the water supply.

Water supply to the bath rooms has since been restored.

(iv) A Company Commander of Railway Protection Force was not on duty and his room was found locked.

It was checked up that the Railway Protection Force official was at Allahabad for taking part in Sports. However, such office rooms should not have been closed during normal working hours.

Instructions not to close office rooms of such officers during working hours, and to make surprise checks to ensure compliance with these instructions, have been issued by the Northern Railway.

(v) The room of the Station Superintendent was found locked.

The day of the inspection was a Sunday and the Station Superintendent was having his weekly rest at his quarter. The Assistant Station Master was, however, available on duty.
