

Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know, Sir, how much foreign exchange will be saved when these factories will come into operation?

The Minister of Production (Shri K. C. Reddy): I am sorry I cannot give a firm estimate of the figure.

Shri Sarangadhar Das: May I know, Sir, whether in case a railway siding is required by a factory,—whether new ones or old ones—the cost is paid by the firm itself and not by the Railway?

Shri R. G. Dubey: There are two aspects here. One is the arterial siding to be constructed from Kurla and terminated at Trombey—the cost for this will be borne by the Railway Ministry. Then there will be feeder lines, the cost for which will be borne by the respective firms

COMMUNITY PROJECT AT JHARGRAM

*237. **Shri S. C. Samanta:** Will the Minister of Planning be pleased to state:

(a) what is the progress made in the work of the Community Project Areas of Jhargram in the district of Midnapur in West Bengal; and

(b) whether the advice and co-operation of the local M.P., M.L.A. and M.L.C. is being sought in this connection?

The Deputy Minister of Irrigation and Power (Shri Hathi): (a) A statement is placed on the Table of the House. [See Appendix II, annexure No. 15.]

(b) Information is awaited from the State Government.

Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know, Sir, whether M.Ps., M.L.As. and M.L.Cs. were invited to the inauguration ceremony of the Community Project?

Shri Hathi: I have no information about that.

Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know Sir, what sort of co-operation is being taken from these non-officials and

whether advisory committee meetings are called now and then?

Shri Hathi: Advisory Committee meetings are called. From the report it appears that the contribution of the villagers also is quite satisfactory.

Shri B. K. Das: May I know, Sir, what progress has been made regarding building the township and starting industry?

Shri Hathi: So far as this project is concerned—community project—the main work that is to be done is on irrigation, agricultural produce and so forth.

Shri B. S. Murthy: Is it not a fact that every Community Project has got an Advisory Committee and in that Committee the local M.Ps., M.L.As. and M.L.Cs. are made members?

Shri Hathi: Exactly. Every project has an Advisory Committee and the Planning Commission have suggested to the States that each Advisory Committee should consist of, or include, local M.Ps., Members of the local Assembly, Members of the District Board, representatives of the village panchayat, social workers, etc.

Shri S. C. Samanta: The statement here says that work in this field (agriculture) was done under the normal development programme of the State Government. May I know whether when such normal works are done in these areas, officers on the normal side and officers on the project side differ and if so, what steps are taken at that time?

Shri Hathi: Generally, Sir, the whole thing is a co-ordinated programme. The project officers have to work in full co-operation with the administrative machinery. So the Agricultural Department naturally has to co-operate with the project officers.
