BSF Jawans Kidnapped by Bangladesh Rifles

3171. SHRI KRISHNA PRATAP SINGH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of border security force jawans kidnapped by the Bangladesh rifles following encounter on the Assam-Bangladesh border during last six months ending 28th February, 1981;

(b) whether Government are aware that these jawans are facing trial on charges of murder by the Bangladesh civil police; and

(c) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) to (c). There were no cases of such kidnapping in the Assam-Bangladesh border. A BSF patrol party had inadvertently crossed into Bangladesh territory on 11th December, 1980 while being engaged in prevention of smuggling activities on Assam-Bangladesh border. On being attacked by a violent crowd, two BSF Jawans Submitted themselves for their personal safety to a Bangladesh Rifles Party which had, by them, reached the spot. Government approached the Bangladesh authorities for the return of the Jawans, and they have been returned on 9th March, 1981.
