

Supply of Fertilizers to States

2953. **Shri Basu Reddy:** Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

(a) whether information in regard to the requirements of fertilizers for the various states for the year 1959-60 has been received by the Centre;

(b) if so, the allocation made to the various states; and

(c) the quantities of fertilizers so far supplied to the various States during this year?

The Deputy Minister of Agriculture (Shri M. V. Krishnappa): (a) Yes; The demand for different kinds of fertilizers received from State Governments and others is given below:

Name of fertilizer	Quantity in tons
1 Sulphate of Ammonia	12,59,661
2 Urea	1,35,045
3 Ammonium Sul Nitrate	1,83,516
4 Cal Ammonium Nitrate	79,846

(b) and (c) The allocations of fertilizers are made by the Central Government on quarterly basis. So far allocations for the first two quarters covering April-September, 1959 have been made. The demands of the various States for the period, the allocations issued and the supplies made so far are given in the statements laid on the Table of the Lok Sabha [See Appendix III, annexure No 107]

Willingdon Hospital, New Delhi
