(c) if not, what amount has not been utilised so far?

**The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda):** (a) to (c). Under the Low Income Group Housing Scheme, no allocations are made separately for rural or urban areas. Out of the revised Second Plan allocation of Rs. 357.91 lakhs for Andhra Pradesh under the Scheme, the State Government have drawn a sum of Rs. 243.51 lakhs in the first four years of the Plan. The remaining amount is available for allocation to them under the Scheme, within the approved ceiling of the State Plan for 1960-61.

A sum of Rs. 208.06 lakhs has been actually spent by the State Government under the Scheme, upto the end of December, 1959, during the current Plan period.

### सस्ते रेडियो सेट

२१८४. श्री विभूति मिश्र : क्या सूचना और प्रसारण मंत्री यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि :

(क) जिन भारतीय ग्रामीणों की वार्षिक आय ५०० रुपये से कम है उन्हें सस्ते रेडियो सेट उपलब्ध कराने के लिये १९६० में क्या व्यवस्था की गयी है; और

(ख) इस व्यवस्था के अन्तर्गत ग्रामीणों को कितने रेडियो सेट उपलब्ध कराये गये हैं ?

सूचना और प्रसारण मंत्री (श्री० के००४) : (क) और (ख). सरकार के यहाँ कोई ऐसी योजना नहीं जिस के अन्तर्गत सस्ते रेडियो सेट ग्रामीण व्यक्तियों को दिये जाये परन्तु ऐसे सेट बनाने के प्रस्ताव विचाराधीन हैं जिन्हें कम आय वाले व्यक्ति भी खरीद सकें ।

इस समय राज्य सरकारों को सामुदायिक रिसेविंग सेट देहातों में लगाने के लिये दिये जाते हैं और इसके लिये केन्द्र सरकार द्वारा दाम (१२५ रुपये प्रति रेडियो तक) भी देती है ।

### Allotment of Shops in Government Colonies

2185. **Shri Ram Garib:** Will the Minister of Works, Housing and Supply be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Co-operative Stores formed by Government servants are allotted shops in the newly built markets in the Government Colonies in Delhi;

(b) if so, what are the broad principles on which such allotments are made; and

(c) whether Government have any objection to the starting of such a Co-operative Store in one of the rooms of Government quarters pending allotment of business premises?

**The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda):** (a) and (b). Government have decided to transfer the shops in the newly built markets in the Government Colonies in Delhi to the Delhi Municipal Corporation or the New Delhi Municipal Committee. The requests received from Co-operative Stores for allotment of shops will, therefore, be considered by the municipal authorities.

(c) Yes, generally.

### Government Quarters in Dev Nagar

Will the Minister of Works, Housing and Supply be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the latrines of 'E' Type Government Quarters in Dev Nagar have not been

provided with cisterns and the water pulling chains;

(b) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(c) what are the difficulties in shifting the cisterns from Tibbia College Quarters to these quarters?

**The Deputy Minister of Works, Housing and Supply (Shri Anil K. Chanda):** (a) Yes.

(b) These quarters were constructed during the year 1943 for meeting the urgent war-time need for additional accommodation. As a measure of economy, permanent specifications were not adopted and cisterns and water pulling chains were also not provided. The proposal to provide water borne sanitation in these quarters is, however, under consideration.

(c) Most of the Tibbia College quarters have been taken over by the College authorities. The cisterns in the quarters with the Central Public Works Department have outlived their life and are not in a fit condition to be shifted.
