THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) and (b) Sri Madhukeshwara Temple of Banavasi in Uttara Kanara District of Karnataka is being maintained by the Archaeological Survey for its preservation. The expenditure incurred during the last three years, for the preservation and maintenance of the temple is as given below:

(c) and (d). The preservation work is in progress. Since preservation of monuments is a continuous process, it is not feasible to fix any definite time limit for completion of the work.

Protocol Signed with USSR on Haematology

(c) the names and members of Indian doctors, scientists etc. to be sent to USSR for research and know-how, duration of their training etc. and similar information of Soviets in India?

A protocol on Haematology was signed during the recent visit of a Soviet delegation of Haematologists to India in December, 1982. (c) These will be finalised in due course, keeping in view our requirements and possibilities of mutual beneficial collaboration between the two countries.
