

person or mainly spoken in the household'. If the mother died in infancy the language mostly spoken in the person's home will be taken as mother-tongue. In the case of infants and deaf mutes the language usually spoken by the mother is the mother-tongue.

(c) 'Mother-tongue' is a term which is universally understood. The definition which has been adopted is easily understood by people. It is not possible to define in precise terms 'language of the person'.

American Coal Mission

2117. Shri Kunhan: Will the Minister of Steel, Mines and Fuel be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received any report from the American Coal Mission which visited India recently; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

The Minister of Steel, Mines and Fuel (Sardar Swaran Singh): (a) and (b). Yes; the report covers a wide ground and includes such aspects as research, training of personnel, transportation facilities and employer-employees relations.

Manipur Police

2118. Shri Braj Raj Singh: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) the number of cases detected by the Vigilance Department (Branch) of Police, Manipur Administration since its inception;

(b) the number of cases prosecuted; and

(c) the number of Class I, II, III Officers involved?

The Minister of Home Affairs (Shri G. B. Pant): (a) Fifteen.

(b) In five cases departmental inquiries have been started. In other cases investigations are in progress. There has been no prosecution in a court of law so far.

(c) In all, twenty-three officers are involved of whom one is a Class I, four are Class II and eighteen are Class III officers.

Grants to Educational Institutes in Punjab

2119. Shri Daljit Singh: Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

(a) the number of educational institutes of Punjab, which applied for non-recurring grants during 1960-61 so far; and

(b) the grant sanctioned to each of these institutes?

S.C. and S.T. Welfare in Himachal Pradesh and Punjab

(a) the amount sanctioned so far for the welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes under the Second Five Year Plan to Himachal Pradesh and Punjab separately; and

(b) the amount spent so far out of these allocations?
