

Drawings Teachers Grade in Delhi Schools

2004. SHRI ISHWAR CHAUDHRY: Will the Minister of EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE be pleased to refer to the reply given to Unstarred Question No. 4772 on the 18th December, 1972 regarding Drawing Teachers Grade in Delhi Schools and to state:

(a) whether T.G.Ts. and other Science and Language Teachers who are teaching only upto VIIIth class in Government Middle Schools of Delhi are not being paid the pay scales of Rs. 250—550, if so, why drawing Teachers and other Grade III Teachers teaching the same classes are deprived of it; and

(b) while all new posts of Drawing Teachers and other Teachers of Grade III are being created in the pay scale of Rs. 250—550, then that is being done for the existing teachers working in the pay-scale of Rs. 220—430?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. YADAV): (a). Trained Graduate Teachers, whether teaching Science subjects or other subjects as well as language teachers are in the pay-scale of Rs. 250—550. For Junior Drawing Teachers (formerly Grade III Drawing Teachers) the prescribed scale is Rs. 220—430, whereas for Senior Drawing Teachers (formerly Grade II Drawing Teachers) the prescribed scale is Rs. 250—550. A Junior Drawing Teacher becomes entitled to promotion to the post of Senior Drawing Teacher after 3 years' experience.

(b) Junior Drawing Teachers (formerly Grade III Drawing Teachers) and other teachers in the same scale are eligible for promotion to the next higher grade of Rs. 250—550.

Demand by Rajkeeya Madhyamik Kala Shikshak Sangh, Delhi

(a) whether the delegation of Rajkeeya Madhyamik Kala Shikshak Sangh, Delhi (Government Secondary Art Teachers' Association, Delhi) had given a memorandum to Deputy Education Minister, on 20th April, 1973 in regard to their demands; and

(b) if so, the demands mentioned in the memorandum and action by Government thereon?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. YADAV) (a) Yes, Sir

(b) The demands made are as under.—

(i) Removal of disparity in pay scales of Drawing Teachers (Grade III) etc. and Trained Graduate Teachers.

(ii) Increase in the percentage of posts in Selection Grade from 15 to 30

(iii) Creation of opportunities for promotion; and

(iv) Provision of change of Cadres

The above demands are being examined in consultation with Delhi Administration.
