SHRI SHARAD YADAV (Madhepura): Mr. Speaker Sir, Reliance issue too has come to fore...(Interruptions)

MR. SPEAKER: This is a place where you should depend on the strength of your arguments and not the volume of your voice. All the same, I think that in the atmosphere, I am finding it very difficult to regulate the

proceedings in the House. I aware of the fact that there are very important issues which the hon. Members want to discuss and they are not having the opportunity to discuss them.

Regarding the Tamil Nadu issue, the Tamil Nadu Members have told me that they are very eager to discuss and we are duty bound to provide some relief; some answers to the problems which the Members want to pose in the House. I hope that the leaders of all the parties will sit and decide as to how to protect the dignity and the prestige of this House, as to how to conduct the business in the House, as to how to raise the questions and get the replies and as to how to find solutions to the problems.

I am adjourning this House now to meet at 11a.m. on Monday and at the same time, I am requesting the Tamil Nadu Members and some of the Karnataka Members to come to my Chamber. I would like to hear them and I would request the Irrigation Minister also to be present there. Later on, we would like to have a meeting of the leaders of all the parties at 12.30 p.m i hope that this should be the last meeting in which they should be able to find some solution to the problem

The House stands adjourned to meet again at 11a.m. on Monday, the 18th December, 1995.
