# POTABLE WATER TO SLUM CLUSTER UNDER "NAL SE JAL" YOJANA

1573. Dr. Kalyan Vaijinathrao Kale:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has any data about the slum cluster in the country and if so, the details thereof, State-wise;

(b) whether the Government has any plan to provide potable water to slum cluster 'Nal se jal' yojana and if so, the details thereof;

(c) the steps taken/likely to be taken by the Government in this regard;

(d) whether there are lots of slum cluster depending on the water tank for daily needs of water and if so, the details thereof, State-wise; and

(e) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to provide pure water?

# ANSWER

#### MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI V. SOMANNA)

(a) : As informed by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Census of India conducts enumeration of population including slums on decadal basis in the country. The last census was conducted in 2011, according to which a total of 6.54 crore people comprising of 1.39 crore households were living in slums across the country. The data on number of slums in the country are collected by the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO). As per the last data of slums collected by NSSO in 2012 during the 69<sup>th</sup> Round Survey, the estimated number of slums in the country is 33,510 which includes 13,761 notified slums and 19,749 non-notified slums. The State/UT-wise number of slums as per NSSO survey 2012, slum households and slum population as per Census-2011 is at **Annexure**. (b) to (e) : Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has informed that 'Land' and 'Colonisation' are State subjects. Schemes related to housing and slum rehabilitation are implemented by State/ UT Governments in their respective regions. Further, as informed, MoHUA is implementing Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), which was Page 1 of 3

launched on 25 June 2015 in selected 500 cities (now 485 cities including 15 merged cities) and towns across the country with a Central Assistance (CA) of Rs.35,990 crore for projects. AMRUT 2.0 was launched on 01 October 2021 with a Central Assistance (CA) of Rs. 66,750 crores for projects.

Under the AMRUT & AMRUT 2.0 scheme, States/ UTs are empowered to design, approve, prioritize and implement the projects including in slum clusters within the broad framework of Mission guidelines. Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) approves State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) under AMRUT and State Water Action Plans (SWAPs) under AMRUT 2.0 as per recommendation of State High Power Steering Committee (SHPSC) headed by Chief Secretary of the States/ UTs.

Under AMRUT, so far, 1,405 water supply projects have been grounded worth Rs. 43,430.25 Crore of which works worth Rs. 41,546.48 Crore have been physically completed. Under AMRUT 2.0, so far, State Water Action Plans have been approved for 3,587 water supply projects worth Rs. 1,14,275.19 Crore submitted by States/ UTs.

Further, to meet the rising aspirations of people living in villages to have piped water supply in their homes, since August 2019, Government of India is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission, in partnership with States to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household across the country.

At the start of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, only 3.23 Crore (16.8%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections. So far, as reported by States/ UTs as on 10.02.2025, under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) – Har Ghar Jal around 12.22 Crore additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections. Thus, as on 10.02.2025, out of more than 19.36 Crore rural households in the country, more than 15.45 Crore (79.79%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes.
