## Need to bring a comprehensive policy for proper distribution of human organs obtained through donations- Laid

SHRI PARSHOTTAMBHAI RUPALA (RAJKOT): In the rural areas of our country, thousands of poor people are blind and disabled. These individuals are not only physically suffering but are also in an extremely vulnerable position socially and economically. If these differently-abled individuals could receive donations of human organs and eyes, it could bring a new hope and light into their lives. However, unfortunately, thousands of poor blind and disabled individuals in rural areas are not able to receive donations of human organs and eyes. The main reason for this is that they lack information about this process. Due to a lack of awareness, they miss out on this important opportunity. Additionally, the facilities for organ and eye transplants in Government hospitals are also very limited. Because of lack of facilities in Government Hospitals, those who could receive help through donations also, remain unable to do transplantations. So far, no concrete policy has been implemented for the distribution of human organs obtained through organ donation, which is why the poor are not able to benefit from these organs. The Central Government should work with State Governments to create a clear and transparent policy in this direction.
