

Regarding need for establishment of Kendriya Vidyalaya in Jarmundi (Dumka), Deoghar and Mahagama (Godda) in Santhal Pargana region of Jharkhand-Laid

DR. NISHIKANT DUBEY (GODDA): Jharkhand state is having two major regions, Santhal Pargana and Chhota Nagpur. Keeping the socio-economic problem being faced by Santhal Pargana in mind where agriculture is only the main source of income, we see an urgent need for a comprehensive plan of action where special emphasis on good and equal opportunity of employment friendly education is given utmost importance. Santhal Pargana districts of Deoghar, Godda, Jamtara, Pakur, Sahibganj and Dumka count amongst the socially, educationally and economically backward districts of the country. A look at the statistics of health, education, income, etc., gives an appalling picture of the poor state of the people. Jharkhand is a rich state. It possesses 40% of India's mineral resources, but the access to resources has made little difference to the lives of the ordinary people. Poverty and ignorance are still the causes for low literacy rates, poor school attendance and large-scale drop-outs. I, therefore seek attention of Hon'ble Minister of Education towards the need to set up three Kendriya Vidyalayas. An ideal location would be Jarmundi (DUMKA), Deoghar and Mahagama (GODDA) in the Santhal Pargana Region.
