

Regarding two shifts of one examination of post-graduate medical NEET examination

KUMARI SUDHA R. (MAYILADUTHURAI): Madam Chairperson, the National Medical Council has announced the year's schedule for post-graduate NEET examination. It is to be held on 5th June. But why is it being held in two shifts? No equality can be achieved if one examination is held in two separate shifts. Last year, when you introduced the two-shift system, there was an uproar among the students as the second shift question papers were considered much tougher than the first shift question paper. Also, the National Medical Council did not release two separate results showing shift-wise performance. It was an admission that if the results were shown separately, it would have exposed the fact that one shift had an easy question paper and the other shift had a tough question paper. Are the Union government and the National Medical Council so inefficient that they cannot have one simultaneous question paper for two lakh students? If you cannot hold a simultaneous examination for two lakh students, why are you talking about one nation, one election for 96 crore people in India?

I would request, through you, the Union Government to kindly have one simultaneous post-graduate NEET examination. Thank you.
