

## **Regarding need to ensure efficient implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission in all parts of the country- laid**

**SUSHRI PRANITI SUSHILKUMAR SHINDE (SOLAPUR):** The Jal Jeevan Mission, though ambitious in scope, faces serious credibility and implementation challenges. The Expenditure Finance Committee's decision to slash the Jal Shakti Ministry's funding demand by 46% raises concerns about flawed financial planning. This is particularly alarming amid allegations of inflated work contracts in several states, pointing to weak accountability and oversight mechanisms. Transparency in tendering, timely cost audits, and independent third-party evaluations remain inadequate. The Government's silence on investigations into these irregularities erodes public trust, as does the lack of a publicly available audit detailing financial discrepancies. With a ₹1.25 lakh crore shortfall, financially weaker states risk stalled progress, deepening regional disparities in tap water access. Further, the Mission's singular focus on tap connections overlooks crucial aspects like water quality, source sustainability, and supply duration. There is limited data on functional service delivery metrics such as hours of daily supply. The credibility gap widens with the JJM dashboard continuing to report outdated coverage figures, even as NSS and rural household data suggest far lower actual penetration. Without updated and verified household data, the Mission's claims risk being seen as inflated. A transparent overhaul is essential to restore faith and ensure equitable water access.
