Need to declare ?Thirukkural? by Thiruvaller as India?s National Book

With a voice that echoes the pride of Tamil Nadu and the conscience of this nation, I rise to humbly urge the Government to declare Thirukkural, authored by the sage Thiruvalluvar as India?s national treasure book. This is not a regional demand. It is a national call for moral recognition.
