Need for utilization of vacant land near Gadwal Railway Station in Telangana by establishing a Skill Development Centre for unemployed youth- Laid

SHRIMATI D. K. ARUNA (MAHBUBNAGAR): I would like to bring to your kind notice that Gadwal Railway Station, located in the heart of Gadwal town, Jogulamba Gadwal District, Telangana, is surrounded by approximately 150 acres of open and unused land. This land, which was generously donated by Maharani Adi Laxmi Devamma of the Gadwal Samsthan to South Central Railways, remains unutilized. In this connection, it is pertinent to mention that the first train service from Secunderabad to Gadwal commenced on February 1, 1916, during the Nizam Era, making Gadwal one of the oldest, busiest, and most recognized railway junctions in the region. Maharani Adi Laxmi Devamma's intention behind donating this land was not only to provide railway facilities but also to create employment opportunities for the rural youth, particularly in auxiliary roles related to the railways. In the light of the Government of India's various initiatives aimed at empowering unemployed youth, I propose the establishment of a support or training center on this open land. This center could focus on skill development, employment generation, and the promotion of rural artisans, aligning with the Hon'ble Prime Minister's vision of creating opportunities for all Hence. I earnestly request the intervention of the Hon'ble Minister of Railways, to kindly consider utilizing this open land at Gadwal Railway Station in my Parliamentary Constituency, Mahbubnagar for the benefit of local youth and artisans, creating job opportunities that will contribute significantly to the socio-economic development of the region.
