MSME UNITS IN ASSAM

3445. SHRI PHANI BHUSAN CHOUDHURY:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) units registered in the country since the year 2016, State and year-wise;
- (b) the number of MSME units currently operational in Assam;
- (c) the details of loans sanctioned to MSME units by banks in Assam from the year 2016-17 to the year 2024-25, Bank-wise;
- (d) the details of MSME units assisted by the Government in Assam, district-wise;
- (e) whether the Government has infused equity of Rs. 50,000 crores under the MSME Self- Reliant India Fund and if so, the State-wise distribution with a focus on Assam; and
- (f) the status and progress of the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) for MSMEs with specific emphasis on Assam?

ANSWER

(a) and (b): Udyam Registration Portal was launched on 01.07.2020. As on 15.03.2025, the total number of MSMEs registered in the country and Assam State on the Udyam Registration (UR) Portal and Udyam Assist Platform was 6.13 Crore and 10.82 Lakh respectively. State-wise and Year-Wise details are given in Annexure-I.

(c): The credit disbursed by the Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) to MSMEs in the state of Assam from FY 2017 is given in Annexure II.

(d): Under Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme, the number of units assisted in the state of Assam during 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 were 3,855; 2,596 and 2,417 respectively. The district wise details are attached in Annexure-III.

(e): The Government of India has announced Fund of Funds with the nomenclature Self Reliant India (SRI) Fund to infuse Rs. 50,000 crore as equity funding in those MSMEs which have the potential and viability to grow and become large units. Out of the total fund of Rs. 50,000 Crore, there is a provision of Rs.10,000 Crore from Government of India and Rs.40,000 Crore through Private Equity / Venture Capital funds. This initiative is aimed at providing growth capital to the deserving and eligible units of MSME sector. This is Central Sector Scheme, under which funds are not released to the State Government.

As reported by NSIC Venture Capital Fund Limited (NVCFL), as on 28.02.2025, total 60 Daughter Funds have been empanelled with NVCFL (Mother Fund) and by way of investing more than Rs. 10,979 Cr, 577 potential MSMEs have been assisted. The State-wise details are given in Annexure - IV.

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(f): The Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) was launched in May, 2020 as part of Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan to support eligible MSMEs and business enterprises in meeting their operational liabilities in view of disruption caused by COVID-19 pandemic. The Scheme was operational till 31.03.2023. Beneficiaries' details of ECLGS are given below.
