

Regarding need to take comprehensive measures to address severe traffic congestion at Dwarka Flyover stretch connecting Palam, Dwarka and IGI Airport in Delhi-Laid

SHRIMATI KAMALJEET SEHRAWAT (WEST DELHI): I rise to draw the urgent attention of the Government to the severe traffic congestion occurring daily at the Dwarka flyover stretch, especially near the Indian Oil signal junction, connecting Palam, Dwarka, and the route towards the Indira Gandhi International Airport. Thousands of commuters, including office goers, students, and emergency vehicles, face massive jams during peak hours, leading to loss of productive hours, increased fuel wastage, and severe air pollution. The narrow flyover design, lack of alternative routes, bottlenecks near bus stops, and absence of traffic regulation during peak times have worsened the crisis. I urge the Union Ministry of Road Transport & Highways and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, in coordination with the Delhi Government, to immediately conduct a joint technical inspection, propose decongestion measures, consider expansion or redesign of the junction, and ensure smooth and safe vehicular movement in this highly sensitive and strategic area. I request that this matter be taken seriously, and appropriate steps be initiated at the earliest in public interest.
