(a)&(b): The traditional tea producing States in the country are Assam, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Kerala. Tea is, however, produced in small quantities in some other States like Karnataka, Tripura, Himachal Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh etc. Production of tea during the last three years in the traditional tea producing States is as follows:

(c)&(d): Production of tea registered substantial increase during 1997 and 1998 over the pervious years. However, during the year 1999 production of tea registered an estimated decline of 64.79 mn.kgs over the previous year mainly due to severe drought during the first quarter of 1999 followed by floods in the later part of the year in some of the tea growing areas.
