STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.541 FOR ANSWER ON 28TH APRIL REGARDING EXPLOITATION OF CONTRACT LABOURERS.

(a): Yes Sir.

(b): The employers often resort to contract labour for reasons like uncertainty of work, cost effectiveness, flexibility in manpower deployment, concentration on core competencies etc.

(c): Yes, Sir.

(d): The Government have enacted the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970 with a view to prevent exploitation of contract labour. It provides for abolition of contract labour, wherever possible and practicable, in certain circumstances and in other cases regulation of their working conditions so as to ensure payment of wages and other amenities relating to their welfare and health. An adequate industrial relations machinery is already in existence to enforce the provisions of the Act/Rules framed there under and to safeguard their interests.
