(c) the steps taken or proposed to be taken by the Government for adoption of Ayurveda System of treatment in Railway hospitals?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 4691 BY SH RAJENDRAN TO BE ANSWERED ON 19.12.2002 REGARDING AYURVEDA SYSTEM OF TREATMENT.

(a) to (c): Ayurveda is a time tested Indian system of medicine and has been in vogue for a long time in the country. It has been recognized by World Health Organisation. However, Ayurveda has not been adopted in the Railway Hospitals.

Medical Services in Indian Railways have been developed in the last 150 years and sustained, based on the specific requirements of Railway Organisation. Some important thrust areas being, Medical fitness certification of a large industrial work force spread across the country which in turn is based on the modern diagnostic and therapeutic criteria, emergency medical care services to meet the needs of Railway beneficiaries, health prevention and promotion based modern medical system etc. Ayurveda will not meet these specific needs. There is no intention to develop parallel medical services in Ayurveda as civilian infrastructure is already existing. Several such Ayurveda facilities are already existing in adequate numbers. As on date, there is no proposal before the Ministry for adoption of Ayurveda system of treatment in Railway hospitals.
