STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.114 TO BE ANSWERED ON 31.07.2000

(a) to (c) : Health for All is the overall aim of the Health Policy of the country which envisages access to health care services, particularly for the poor and disadvantaged. Government is striving to achieve better health care through a variety of measures including the implementation of several National Programmes, renovation and modernisation of the health infrastructure and augmentation of medical manpower particularly in rural areas. In view of the significant epidemiological and demographic changes in the country since 1983, when the first National Health Policy was formulated, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has undertaken an exercise to revise the National Health Policy.

A study group has been constituted which is in the process of drafting the National Health Policy. Four Working Groups have also been constituted for obtaining suggestions regarding some important aspects such as strengthening of public health infrastructure at the State level, human resource development including medical education, inter-sectoral coordination and interface between indigenous and modern medicine. The inputs of Working Groups would be considered for inclusion in the revised National Health Policy.
