Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has made any survey to find out the percentage of persons engaged in Agricultural, Industrial and service sectors in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise and sector-wise;
- (c) the average annual income earning of each of above sector in various States; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to increase the income particularly in rural areas of the country?

Answer

MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI K. CHANDRASEKHAR RAO)

- (a & b) State-wise and sector-wise percentage of employed persons on usual status basis during 1999-2000 are given in Annexure-I.
- (c) Industry-wise average wage/salary earnings per day received by regular wage/salaried employees of age 15-59 years during 1999-2000 are given in Annexure -II.
- (d) Government is implementing various employment generation and poverty alleviation programmes in the rural areas of the country. These include Swarna Jayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana (SGSY), Sampoorn Gramin Rozgar Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana, Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana etc. Besides these, a National Rural Employment Guarantee Bill has already been tabled in Parliament, which provides for 100 days of employment for every poor family in rural areas. A food for work programme has already been launched in selected backward districts of the country.
