STATEMENT AS REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.438 FOR 04.05.2007 REGARDING "DECLINE IN NUMBER OF SCIENTISTS".

(a) & (b): No Sir. According to the available official statistics, the stock of Scientific and Technical personnel in the country has arisen from 7.8 million in 2000 to 8.1 million in 2001. Of which, nearly 1 lakh S&T personnel remain engaged in Research and Development activities every year.

(c) to (e): Yes Sir. The details of the utilisation of the funds for research by Central Scientific Departments during the 10th Five Year Plan are given in the table below. The corrective steps taken in this regard include changes in the existing project approval process, quarterly monitoring of flow of funds and awareness creation among the scientific community about various schemes.
