FOUR LANING OF NATIONAL HIGHWAYS IN RAJASTHAN

Will the Minister of SHIPPING, ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of proposals pertaining to four-laning of National Highways submitted by the State Government of Rajasthan for approval of the Union Government during the last three years;
- (b) the action taken by the Union Government thereon;
- (c) the number of proposals which are pending with the Union Government for approval; and
- (d) the time by which these proposals are likely to be implemented?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING, ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI K. H. MUNIYAPPA)

(a) The following proposals for four-laning of National Highways (NHs) in Rajasthan have been submitted by the Government of Rajasthan to Government of India:

1	8	Kishangarh-Ajmer-Beawar-Udaipur
2	11	Jaipur-Reengus-Sikar
3	12	Jaipur-Tonk-Kota-Jhalawar-Madhya Pradesh Border
4	14	Beawar-Pali-Sirohi-Pindwara

(b)to(d) Four-laning of Jaipur-Reengus-Sikar section of NH-11, Jaipur-Tonk-Kota-Jhalawar section of NH-12 is included in National Highway Development Project (NHDP) Phase- IIIA and four-laning of Kishangarh-Ajmer-Beawar section of NH-8, Beawar-Pali-Sirohi-Pindwara section of NH-14 is included in NHDP Phase-III B.Consultancy work for preparation of feasibility study/Detailed Project Report (DPR) of these sections is in progress or awarded recently. Four laning of Beawar-Udaipur section of NH-8 is not included in any Phase of NHDP but it is proposed to carry out feasibility study on DBFO pattern for the same. It is premature to indicate target for four laning of these stretches since project reports are yet to be completed.

Jhalawar –Madhya Pradesh Border section of NH-12, does not qualify for four-laning.
