- (a) The names of the programmes started under new industrial policy in rural and tribal areas of Rajasthan;
- (b) The names of the areas in Rajasthan where these programmes are being implemented;
- (c) Whether these programmes have benefited the rural and tribal people of Rajasthan; and
- (d) If so, the details thereof ?

**Answer**

(a) to (d): Under the liberalised Industrial Policy, decision to set up industry depends upon the commercial judgement of the entrepreneur which, in turn, is also based on the initiatives taken by the State Government by way of providing basic infrastructural facilities and other incentives. Industrial Development is primarily the responsibility of the concerned State Government. The Central Government supports the efforts by providing support/incentive under its various Schemes, particularly for development of industrially disadvantaged areas

The Central Government has, up to 31.12.2004, released Rs. 40.20 crore as assistance for setting up the following Growth Centres in Rajasthan:

The Government of India has sanctioned upgradation of infrastructure facilities at Marble Cluster Kishangarh under the Industrial Infrastructure Upgradation Scheme (IIUS) at a tentative cost of Rs.36.80 crore. Out of this amount the share of the Central Government is Rs.27.60 crore.
