- (a) whether the tuition fees in Kendriya Vidyalayas have been raised;

- (d) whether there is any proposal to review the fee hike; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof including the time by which decision is likely to be taken by the Government in this regard?

Since the tuition fees were last revised on 1.10.1998 and in the light of the increase in re-imbursment of tuition fee of the children of Central Government employees following the implementation of the recommendations of the 6th Central Pay Commission, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) has enhanced the tuition fees in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) with effect from 1.10.2009 as under:-
