Funds to States for Basic Facilities

**Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether the Government has formulated any comprehensive policy to provide basic facilities to citizens in urban areas including maintenance of slums in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of fund provided to States during the previous and current five year plan for the purpose;
- (d) the details of funds utilised by States against allocation, State/UT wise; and
- (e) whether the said funds have been diverted to other schemes, if so, the details thereof and corrective measures taken by the Government in this regard?

(a) and (b): Government, in June, 2015 launched Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) to provide basic facilities to citizens like water supply, sewerage, drainage, urban transport and green spaces/parks in 500 mission cities. The mission period is 5 years starting from 2015-16. Another major scheme launched by the Government in this direction in June, 2015 is the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) Mission [PMAY (U)] with an objective to address the housing requirement of urban poor including slum dwellers. The PMAY(U) Mission also envisages that the houses constructed by States/UTs should have basic civic infrastructure like water, sanitation, sewerage, road, electricity etc. Earlier, Government assisted States/UTs to provide housing and basic civic amenities to urban poor including slum dwellers through the Basic Services to Urban Poor (BSUP) and Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP) components of Jawahar Lal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission and Rajiv Awas Yojana. Further, Government has also launched Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) on 2 October, 2014 with the aim to make India clean by 2 October, 2019. The Mission covers 4041 statutory towns/cities as per census, 2011. The urban component of SBM inter alia includes provision of household, community & public toilets and solid waste management in urban areas.
