(a) to (e) Government has received proposals from the states in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) for financial assistance under National Health Mission (NHM) to strengthen their healthcare systems including for improving the infrastructural and other facilities in their respective Government hospitals. The PIPs submitted by States/UTs and approvals issued in the form of Records of Proceedings (RoPs) during the last three years are available in public domain <http://nhm.gov.in/nrhm-in-state/state-program-implementation-plans-pips.html>. Resources are allocated to states based on budgetary allocation made for National Health Mission in the Union Budget. The year 2016-17 is the last year of the current Five Year Plan. As such, additional funds to the states in the current Five Year Plan may be available only if there is enhancement in the budget allocation for NHM at RE stage and /or if the states earn incentives based on performance on key health indicators and health sector reforms.
