Will the Minister of Electronics and Information Technology be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to set up Digital village Panchayats in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State and Union Territory-wise;
- (a) the number of village Panchayats linked with digital revolution so far, State and Union Territory-wise; and
- (b) the steps being taken by the Government to remove the hurdles in this regard?

Answer

(a), (b) and (c): In line with the vision of Digital India, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has envisaged the pilot project of DigiGaon to be implemented in 1050 Gram Panchayats (GPs) spread across 30 States and UT. This project intends to provide a platform for availability of services namely tele-education, tele-medicine, LED Street Lighting & Wi-Fi Hotspot and skill development to the people at the Gram Panchayat level in select block(s) across various States and UT.

For the purpose of identification of pilot block(s), the competent authorities in the pilot States and UTs would be required to identify the pilot block for their respective States/UT.

The details of locations to be taken up under this pilot project, State and UT wise, are given in the Annexure.

(d): The project has been conceptualized and approved in consultation with all pilot States and UT, line Ministries including Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, other agencies like NIC, ERNET, CDAC etc and industry players.
