To ensure that there are no more Hiroshimas and Nagasakis, we should lead the world through non-violent path. We should whole-heartedly support all the endeavours in this direction. We should also build our will and determination to oppose all forces that work against human peace and prosperity.

The House may now observe a minute's silence in memory of the freedom fighters and the victims of atomic holocaust.
