Title: Regarding discovery of a large super cluster of galaxies by Indian Scientists.

DR. TAPAS MANDAL (RANAGHAT): Very recently a team of Indian astronomers from the Inter University Centre for Astronomy & Astrophysics (IUCAA), and Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Pune and members of two other Indian universities, have identified a previously unknown, extremely large super cluster of galaxies located in the direction of constellation Pisces. This is one of the largest known structures in the nearby Universe, and is at a distance of 4,000 million (400 crore) light-years away from the earth.

This novel discovery is being published in the latest issue of the *Astrophysical Journal*, the premier research journal of the American Astronomical Society. We congratulate Dr. Somak Raychaudhury, Director of IUCAA, Pune, co-author of this paper, Joydeep Bagchi from IUCAA, the lead author of the paper and Shishir Sankhyayan, co-author and PhD scholar at IISER, Pune and others for their proud discovery.
