

Bill which I introduced at the last meeting of the Council was to give Local Governments wider discretion in the matter of agricultural advances, in accordance with the intention which we had announced in a Resolution issued some months ago. We therefore did not think it necessary to consult them, and we have received no criticisms upon the Bill."
