32. SHRI CHANDRASHEKHAR SAHU : Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the population of Christians in 1951, 1981 and 1991 and also the total population of the country in those years;

(b) the population of Christians and Hindus in Gujarat in the aforesaid years as comparing with the population of non-Christian Adivasis in Gujarat;

(c) the number of Christians in Dang District in 1951, 1981 and 1991; and

(d) whether the Government have analysed the reasons for rate of growth in the population of Christians in the Adivasi Belt in Gujarat and particularly in Dang?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L.K. ADVANI) : (a) The total population of the country and the population of Christians in 1951, 1981 and 1991 are given below :-

1. The figures in the above statement do not include figures for Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Jammu & Kashmir and Pondicherry for the sake of comparability at all India level for the following reasons :

- (i) In case of Jammu & Kashmir, no Census was conducted in 1991. As such religion-wise data is not available. Similarly religion-wise figures for 1951 Census are also not available.
- (ii) In case of Assam, figures for 1981 are not available as no Census was conducted in the State at that time.
- (iii) In case of Arunachal Pradesh religion-wise break-up of population for 1951 Census is not available.
- (iv) Religion-wise break-up of population for Pondicherry for the year 1951 is not available.

2. Religion-wise break-up of 268,602 persons of Punjab State is not available and figures in col. 3 do not include this population.

Guest Teacher Scheme

34. SHRI PRITHVIRAJ D. CHAVAN : Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

(a) whether the University Grants Commission (UGC) has formulated a Guest Teacher Scheme for teachers posted in border States; and

(b) if so, the main features of the scheme?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT, MINISTER OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND MINISTER OF DEPARTMENT OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI) : (a) and (b) The UGC has not formulated any "Guest Teacher Scheme". However, it has created a few positions of visiting faculty in the Universities since 1990-91 to provide teaching/research assignments to teachers from Kashmir University and its affiliated colleges. It has been decided to continue the scheme upto 31st March, 2000 or till such time the position in Kashmir valley normalises. These visiting positions are classified into categories 'A', 'B' and 'C' carrying a consolidated honorarium at the rate of Rs. 2,500/- per month, Rs. 3,000/- per month and Rs. 4,000/- per month respectively. These teachers continue to draw their salaries from their respective Universities/Colleges in addition to the above honorarium.

Historical Monuments under the Archaeological Survey of India

35. SHRI A.C. JOS : Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

(a) the number of historical monuments and sites are under the Archaeological Survey of India, State-wise; and

(b) the total allocation made by the Union Government for the upkeep and development of these monuments and sites during each of the last three years, state-wise?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT, MINISTER OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND MINISTER OF DEPARTMENT OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI) : (a) 3598 historical monuments and sites are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India. State-wise break-up is given in statement-I attached.

(b) The total allocation made by the Government for the upkeep and development of these monuments and sites during the years 1995-96, 1996-97 and 1997-98, State-wise, is given in statement-II attached.
