CALLING ATTENTION TO MATTER OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

REPORTED SHUT-DOWN OF BHARAT PETROLEUM CORPORATION REFINERY AT BOMBAY OWING TO LEAKAGE IN ONE OF ITS FURNACE TUBES

SHRI B.V. DESAI (Raichur): Mr. Speaker, Sir, I call the attention of the Minister of Petroleum, Chemicals and Fertilisers to the following matter of urgent public importance and I request that he may make a statement thereon:—

"The reported shut-down of Bharat Petroleum Corporation Refinery at Bombay owing to leakage in one of its furnace tubes and the action taken by Government in the matter."

THE MINISTER OF PETRO-LEUM, CHEMICALS AND FER-TILISER (SHRI P. SHIV SHAN-KAR: Sir, the Bharat Petroleum Corporation Refinery in Bombay had to be shut-down on March 31, 1982, on account of a rupture in the furnace tubes of the crude distillation unit that was noticed. Action was immediately taken to mobilise the requisite expertise and equipment so that the work of repairing the damaged tubes could commence as soon as the furnace cooled down. These repairs commenced on April 3, 1982. All possible steps are being taken to complete these repairs in the shortest possible time to restart the
