(ii) REPORTED SHIFTING OF THE HEAD-QUARTERS OF PYRITES, PHOSPHATE AND CHEMICALS LTD. FROM DEHRI-ON-SONE

SHRI RAMAVATAR SHASTRI (Patna): The Managing Director, Pyritas, Phosphates and Chemicals Ltd., has initiated a move to shift the headquarters of the company from Denrion-Sone to New Delhi. Some of the offices of this undertaking under the Government of India have already been shifted there.

This Projects was started in 1960 at Amjhore in the districts of Rohtas where pyrites was mined from the Karmur Hin Range. In 1962, its head-quarters was established at Dehrion-Sone.

During the Emergency, without the permission of the Government, it is learnt, the Managing Director shifted his office to New Delhi.

As the Managing Director remains at New Delhi, all the remaining high officials have to run there for consultation even for minor problems. A peon goes practically every day to New Delhi for carrying files to the Managing Director. Recently he has issued instructions that, with a view to expedite work, the office of the General Manager at Amphore will be shifted to New Delhi. Till how, offices of about a dozen officers have already been removed to New Delhi. The rest are awaiting orders. Finally, the headquarters willbe shif ed to New Delhi from Dehri-on-Zone. Thus the local people will be denied employment opportunity. Some employees have to forego their promotion they were not in a position to go to This move to shift the headquarters to New Delhi is backed by other officers who belong to Delhi or nearby places and do not want stay at Delhi-on-Sone.

When the Managing Director lived and worked at Amjhore, the head-

quarters expenditure in 1974-1975 was Rs. 1,23,484; and the Amjhore office expenditure was Rs. 1,03,604.

When the Managing Director shifted to New Delhi, the head-quarters expenditure in 1978-79 was Rs. 2,17,703; and the Amjhore office expenditure in 1978-79 was Rs. 2,53,377.

This extra expenditure was incurred to pay travelling allowances to the officers to go to New Delhi. addition to the above, the expenditure over entertainment which was Rs. 1463/- in 1974-75 has gone up to Rs. 16,000 in 1978-79. It is also learnt that the rent of the residential office at Delhi which was Rs. 600 per month has been increased to Rs. 9,000 per month. The headquarters is housed in a building here for which Rs. 3,500 are paid as rent. The Board of Directors has already decided construct the office building and residences for the employees by acquiring government land at Dehri-on Sone

the general demand of Ιt the people that the headquarters of Pyrites, Phosphates and Chemicals Ltd. should not be shifted to New Delhi and that offices of the Managing Director and other officers must be brought back to Dehri-on-Sone as before, not only in the interest of the State but also for efficient functioning of the Project. The Government should pay immediate attention to this urgent matter of public importance and dispel the doubts in the minds of the people of the State of Bihar.

(iii) Ratnagiri Project of Aluminium Plant

SHRI BAPUSAHEB PARULEKAR (Ratnagiri): Under rule 377 of the Rules of Procedure I want to invite the attention of the hon. Minister of Steel and Mines to the following matter of urgent public importance.

The Ratnagiri project of aluminium plant hailed as a destiny project for the economic uplift of backward Konkan is stll not out of woods so far as Government of India is concerned, and has been hanging for about 11 years now. This Rs. 80 crore project was finalised as early as 1966 by the Planning Commission which allocated Rs. 135 crores two aluminium plants—one at Korba in Madhya Pradesh and the other at Ratnagiri in Maharashtra to be constructed by BALCO and to be completed towards the end of the Fifth Plan. The Korba plant is now stream while the project report is still gathering dust in BALCO office in Delhi regarding the Ratnagiri plant. And this is in spite of Rs. 1.37 crores initially invested for the acquisition of land and preparation of blue prints made by the Central Government. Over all these years, the infrastructure has been built up at a cost of about Rs. 3 crores by the State Government and Ratnagiri has been developed as an all-weather port to facilitate the import of machinery export of alumina to be produced.

In fact the State Government had proposed to have the foundation stone of the project laid on October 2, 1974. The then Chief Minister of Maharashtra had approached Mrs. Gandhi to lay the foundation stone, but she could not come as she was preoccupied and the foundation stone could not be laid on that day.

The Government is reducing the allocation on this project every year. The report of the Steel Ministry shows that no amount is being allocated this year on this project. This is prima facie proof of government's intention to abandon and shelve the project The project is likely to be shelved immediately after this session is over as no funds are made avail-

able to the project, shattering all the hopes of the people of Konkan who were all the while thinking that their dreams of commencement of industrialisation of this area would be fulfilled.

As the Demands of the Ministry of Steel and Mines are not likely to be debated, I request the hon. Minister of Steel and Mines to make a statement on the project and say that the project will not be shelved.

(iv) Steps to eradicate cholera from Nawada district of Bihar

श्री कृंबर राम (नवादा): बिहार का नवादा जिला हर दिष्ट से अत्यन्त पिछड़ा हुआ जिला हो। नया जिला होने के कारण प्रशासनिक एवं अन्य सृदिधाओं से यह परि-पूर्ण नहीं हो सका है। स्वास्थ्य सम्बन्धी सृविधा से वंचित रहने के ही कारण 24 घंटों में यहां पांच व्यक्ति हैं जोर इसके पहले निकट ही मैं पांच और मर चके हैं। संकामक रूप यह रोग धारण कर चुका है। स्वास्थ्य मंत्रालय का मैं इस और ध्यान आकृष्ट कर रहा हू तािक शीघृता से उक्त रोग को फैलने से रोका जा सके।

(v) Reported Strike by Transport Contractors at Dal Irajhar Mines (Madhya Pradesh) affecting supply of raw materials to Hillai Steel Plant

SHRI ARVIND NETAM (Kanker): With your kind permission I am raising an important matter of public importance under Rule 377 and I would like to draw the attention of the hon. Minister for Steel and Mines.

The transport contractors at Dallirajhara mines in Madhya Pradesh are on strike since 20th May, 1980 thereby seriously affecting the transportation of raw material such as iron ore meant for Bhilai steel plant. The Bhilai steel plant generally keeps stock of iron ore for 2 to 3 months and if this strike continues further,
