## BUSINESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

### Twenty-Sixth Report

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND COMMUNICATIONS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH) : I move :

"That this House do agree with the Twenty-sixth Report of the Business Advisory Committee presented to the House on the 5th December, 1968."

MR. SPEAKER : Now, the motion before the House is the Report of the Business Advisory Committee. Last week, when the Business Advisory Committee met, it allotted 5 hours for this. Yesterday, we had already taken 5 hours in taking constitutional objections to the introduction of it. But that does not matter. Yesterday, we again allotted 5 hours for this, without taking that into consideration, not only 5 hours but 2 hours more and we made it 7 hours. I think, that was agreed to. If you add 5 hours that we spent yesterday, it means 12 hours we are spending on this. This was the decision taken yesterday by the Business Advisory Committee with all friends sitting there.

So ask the the Government to withdraw the Bill and all that, you can say that during the discussion of the Bill. The whole of yesterday was spent constitutional points that they must withdraw it. If, at this stage, you again begin discussion on that point, it will go on as it happened yesterday and the whole of the today will be spent like that. This is the Report of
