Large-scale planting of Eucalyptus was started in the Third Five Year Plan period under the scheme of "Plantation of fast growing species" and other development schemes

(b) Research conducted at the Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun, has indicated that Eucalvotus does not have adverse effect on environment. Food and Agricultural Organisation has reported in 1985 that scientific investigation does not indicate that Eucalyptus is bad for environment.
