DEATHS OF MEMBERS

Mr. Speaker: I regret to inform the House of the sad demise of four friends, viz., Shri Syamnandan Sahaya, Dr. Manik Chand Jatav-vir, Shri B. G. Kher and Dr. R. U. Singh.

Shri Syamnandan Sahaya passed away on the 14th March, 1957, at Muzaffarpur at the age of 56. He was a sitting Member of the House from Muzaffarpur Central constituency of Bihar. He was also a Member of the Constituent Assembly of India and the Provisional Parliament.

Dr. Manik Chand Jatav-vir passed away on the 29th December, 1956, at Agra. He was a sitting Member of the House from Bharatpur-Sawai Madhopur-Reserved Scheduled Castes constituency of Rajasthan.

Shri B. G. Kher passed away on the 8th March, 1957 at Poona at the age of 68. He was a Member of the Constituent Assembly of India and served the country devotedly and efficiently as India's High Commissioner in London and the Chairman of the Official Language Commission. In his death, India has lost a great 606 L.S.D.

son, an eminent scholar, statesman and social reformer.

Dr. R. U. Singh passed away on the 12th January, 1957, in Lucknow at the age of 52. He was a Member of the Constituent Assembly of India (Legislative) and the Provisional Parliament of India.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Secretary: Sir, I beg to lay on the Table a copy of the President's Address to both Houses of Parliament assembled together on the 18th March 1957.

President's Address

राष्ट्रपति : संसद के सदस्यगण, माज मैं पूरे एक वर्ष के बाद भ्राप के सामने भ्रभिभाषण कर रहा हं। यह वर्ष हमारे देश के लिये ग्रीर विश्व के लिये महत्वपूर्ण घटनाओं से पूर्ण रहा है । हम ऐसे समय एकत्र हये हैं जब कि देश भर में माम चनाव चल रहे हैं भौर इनके परिणाम-स्वरूप नई संसद्की स्थापना होने जा रही है। इस संसद के सम्मूख कुछ कहने का मेरे लिये यह मन्तिम भवसर है। अपने निर्वाचन-क्षेत्रों के प्रतिनिधि के रूप में आप में से कुछ नई संसद में भी आयेंगे झौर संभवतः कुछ सदस्यगण नई संसद में नहीं भायेंगे। माप का कार्यक्षेत्र कहीं भी हो, मुझे इस में संदेह नहीं कि जो कूछ भी आप करेंगे वह इस देश के निर्माण संबंधी महान कार्य के हित में होगा । मैं भाप के कार्य में सफलता और झाप की सम्पन्नता की कामना करता हं।

पिखली बार जब मैंने भाप के सामने मभिमाषण दिया था, तब से संसार ने, विश्लेष कर मध्यपूर्व ने, तनाव की स्थिति का सामना किया है मौर एक ऐसा संघर्ष भी देखा है जिस का भन्तिम रूप मिस्न पर भाकमण हुमा । संयुक्तराष्ट्र के हस्तक्षेप भौर संसार के जनमल के फलस्वरूप माकमणकारी सेनामों को मिस्न से हुटा लिया गया, किन्तु इस संघर्ष से मिस्न को मारी क्षति ही नहीं उठानी पड़ी बल्कि ऐसे समय जब भन्तराष्ट्रीय स्थिति में सुवार होता विकाई दे रहा या बनाव में वृद्धि हुई । इस
