## Employment to Family Member of an **Employee Seeking Premature Retire**ment

1043. SHRIPRAHLAD SINGH PATEL: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether any priority is accorded in employment to any member of the family of an employee seeking pre-mature retirement; and

## (b) if so, the details thereof?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRI VISH-WANATH PRATAP SINGH): (a) and (b). No, Sir, However, in exceptional cases when a Department is satisfied that the condition of the family is indigent and is in great distress, the benefit of compassionate appointment can be extended to a son/daughter/ near relative of a Government servant retired on medical grounds under Rule 38 of Central Civil Services (Pensions) Rules, 1972, or corresponding provisions in the Central Civil Service Regulations before attaining the age of 55 years. In case of Group 'D' employees whose normal age of superannuation is 60 years, compassionate

appointment can be considered where they are retired on medical grounds before attaining the age of 57 years.
